

# APA Quick Guide

## Building your research paper

### Formatting Basics

---

- Use white paper 8.5" x 11"
- 1" margins on all sides
- Black font
- Double spaced font
- Click on "remove extra space after paragraph"
- Print single sided

### Title Page

---

- Header with page number
- Full title of your paper
- Full name
- Institution you're writing from  
[Northwood Tech]

### Main Body

---

- Header with page number
- Left justified text with each paragraph starting with a .5" tab
- Use proper grammar, sentence structure, and no contractions
- Type out numbers one through nine

### Reference Page

---

- Header with page number
- Hanging indent for citations
- Double spaced

### Double-Check

---

- Does your instructor have requirements for font size and type
- Does your instructor require an abstract
- Even though programs like Microsoft Word have built in citation tools, they only work as well as the information put in. Double check any generated citations for proper formatting.

### Reference Examples

---

#### In-Text Citations:

*When paraphrasing and using the authors name in the sentence, simply add the date.*

As illustrated by Dr. Seuss in his book *The Sneetches and other stories* (1961), the roots of segregation are arbitrary.

*Direct quote containing less than 40 words:*

"They kept them away. Never let them come near. And that's how they treated them year after year" (Seuss, 1961, p.7).

#### Journal Article:

Author last name, First name initial. Middle name initial (year). Title of article. *Title of journal*, volume(number), first page-last page. <https://doi.org/xxxx>

Philip, S. (2018). Caught in-between: social developments and young men in urban India. *Journal of Gender Studies*, 27(3), 362–370. <https://doi.org/10.1080/09589236.2017.1391689>

#### Websites:

Author, A. ( Date of Publication). *Title of Document*. [http:// www.xxxxxxx.xxx](http://www.xxxxxxx.xxx)

Sea Turtle Restoration Project. (2006). *Threats to sea turtles*.

*If the website doesn't list an author's name, use the copyright holder like the example above.*

*If the website doesn't list a publication date, use (n.d.) in place of the date*
